Prince George Campus - Elementary Years (K-7)**

Applicants to the Prince George Elementary Years Program must have one of the following:

1. a four-year bachelor's degree (120 credits) with a minimum of sixty (60) credits in Arts, Science, or other teachable fields relevant to the BC School system, including prerequisite coursework and thirty (30) senior level credits in a teachable field  
OR
2. 90 credits of academic coursework with a minimum of sixty (60) credits in Arts, Science or other teachable fields relevant to the BC School system including prerequisite coursework and thirty (30) senior level credits in a teachable field  
OR
3. a UNBC Education Diploma in a First Nations Language and Culture (92 credits)
  - ✓ Time Limit Transfer Credit for coursework relating to the required 90 credits.  
Please see UNBC Regulations and Policies - *Time Limit for Transfer Credit* (p. 57, 2010-2011 Undergraduate Academic Calendar)
  - ✓ minimum grade point average of "C+" (67%, or 2.33 based on a 4.33 point grading system) on the most recent 60 credit hours of university transferable credits
  - ✓ prior experience with learners of the age and/or grade they wish to teach

**\*\*REQUIRED PREREQUISITE COURSEWORK:**

Elementary (K-7)	
2 English Courses NOTE: English courses must have a final average grade of C+ or better	(3) credits of English literature plus (3) credits of composition or six credits of English Literature
1 Mathematics course	(3) credits of mathematics. Statistics courses do not meet the requirement.
1 Lab Science Course	(3) credits of a laboratory science. (This course must contain a lab component.)
2 Canadian Studies Courses	(6) credits in Canadian Studies. Courses must contain significant Canadian content.
