• Mission

The Mission of the School of Education at the University of Northern British Columbia is to educate teachers to the profession, and to further prepare professional educators at the Master's level who may wish to pursue advanced study at the doctoral level and/or advanced professional employment. The School of Education is committed to achieving excellence through building partnerships and by being innovative, resourceful, and responsive to student and community needs.

• Values

The values of the School of Education are beliefs that we hold in the highest regard, which guide our actions and support each person affiliated with the School of Education in the fulfillment of their ambitions.

• Learning

Learning is a continuous lifelong process -- a necessary part of human development. The School of Education believes in a learner-centred, inquiry-oriented approach to teaching. As they begin their professional careers, teachers must have the theoretical knowledge, practical knowledge, pedagogical skills, and confidence to adapt to the characteristics learners bring into their classrooms. Our aim, as a School of Education, is to provide both the beginning teacher and the returning professional opportunities to learn, and to assist them to achieve personal enrichment through reflective practice and critical inquiry.

• Excellence

The School of Education strives for excellence in the fundamental roles of teaching, research, and service to students and to the wider educational community. We recognize that the educational enrichment of our students is the ultimate measure of excellence. The School of Education is committed to providing all students with a high standard of educational and student services, and, furthermore, services that is equivalent across each of our campuses.
