

Northern Collaborative Baccalaureate Nursing Program

PRE-REQUISITE EQUIVALENCIES

Applicants are required to successfully complete the necessary grade 11 and 12 courses or obtain a Dogwood Certificate with a minimum C+ grade in each required course. Other ways to meet admission requirements for the NCBNP are as follows:

1. Successfully complete the equivalent grade 12 courses in the required subjects through the College and Career Preparation program at CNC or your local college. Students must obtain a minimum C+ grade in each course. The approved courses available at CNC are in the advanced or provincial certificate program:

CNC Mathematics 045
CNC English 050
CNC Chemistry 045
CNC Biology 050

NWCC MATH 0401-3 and MATH 0402-3
NWCC ENG 050-6
NWCC CHEM 040-6 OR 0401-3/0402-3
NWCC BIOL 050-6 OR 0501-3/0502-3

Students may also successfully complete post-secondary courses at college or university in the required subject areas. Students must obtain a minimum C grade in each required course to be admissible to the program. The following courses are approved by the nursing program for meeting admission requirements (Date reviewed – February 2006):

Biology:

- CNC BIOL 107 or 111 or equivalent
- NWCC BIOL 101 or equivalent
- UNBC BIOL 101 or equivalent

English:

- CNC ENGL 101 or 102 or 103 or 104 or equivalent
- NWCC ENGL 101 or 102, or both 151 and 152, or equivalent
- UNBC ENGL 170 or 100 or equivalent

Chemistry:

- CNC CHEM 112 or CHEM 114 or equivalent.
- NWCC CHEM 102 or equivalent. (Note that CHEM 101 or 121 are prerequisites for CHEM 102 at NWCC).
- UNBC CHEM 101, plus CHEM 121, the lab component to CHEM 101.
(Please note that CHEM 100 is a pre-requisite for CHEM 101 at UNBC
Therefore to complete the chemistry pre-requisite *at UNBC*, a student would need to complete CHEM 100 and 101 as well as their respective lab components, CHEM 120 and 121.)

*****Math:***

- CNC MATH 100 or equivalent
- NWCC MATH 111 and 112, or equivalent
- UNBC MATH 115 or equivalent

****NOTE:** - a course in statistics is not acceptable as the Math 11 pre-req - if a student has Math 12 and Math 11, the higher mark will be used for nursing admission ranking.
