Park Interpreter

Duties: Design and deliver interpretive day programs, walks and evening programs to visitors in provincial parks. **Programs will:**

- present the park's natural and cultural features and recreational opportunities in the park through informative and entertaining youth and family programming
- deliver Jerry's Rangers children's programming
- promote programming and accurately record statistics
- communicate to media to publicize programs and events, and provide in-park promotion
- act as roving interpreter throughout the campground and encourage campers to attend programs
- encourage local stewardship activities
- inform park visitors about park conservation values, about safe and appropriate behaviour in the outdoors, and about other attractions in the region

Interpretive Programs will focus on evening presentations and day time Jerry's Rangers programs. Generally, programs will be presented on weekends in June and five days a week (Thursday - Monday) in July and August. Some programs will target children, such as Jerry's Rangers programs, while others will target families.

Skills: Excellent communication skills and enthusiasm about working with a wide variety of the public. Natural history knowledge and an interest in outdoor recreation activities is also an asset.

Term of Employment: 13 weeks beginning June 2 through to August 30th

Hours of Employment: 5-day work week, 7 hours per day will include evenings and weekends with two weekdays off. All summer statutory holidays will be worked with alternate day off in lieu.

Wage: \$12.50 per hour

Qualifications: **Must be a full time student and planning to return to school full time in the fall.**

Enrolled in post secondary degree program or certificate in environmental studies, biology-related program, geography, education, fish & wildlife or outdoor recreation.

Successful candidates will be subject to a criminal records check.

Bike is provided for interp at Park, drivers license and vehicle (not provided) is an asset.

WCB recognized Level 1 First Aid is an asset
