PARKS & SPECIAL PLACES

The Parks & Special Places Division is the lead Territorial agency responsible for the protection of natural and cultural landscapes in Nunavut. The division works with Nunavut residents to identify and protect territorial parks and special places, understanding that they mean many things to many people: they are places of escape, places for reflection, places of power, and places that celebrate our cultural and natural heritage. They are places filled with awe, meaning and attachment. We are committed to establishment of a system of parks and special places that represent these values, are planned and managed jointly with Inuit, and provide benefits to Nunavut residents.

► COORDINATOR, PARK MANAGEMENT PLANNING [Iqaluit]

The Coordinator, Park Management Planning is the division's lead in reviewing and developing park management plans. This includes coordinating background research, completing ecological and cultural landscape inventories, facilitating community consultations, and developing new frameworks and methodologies.

► COORDINATOR, PARK MASTER PLANNING [Iqaluit]

The Coordinator, Park Master Planning leads the development of feasibility studies, background reports, research and consultations towards new Park Master Plans and site plans for Nunavut's Territorial Parks and Special Places. The position also leads the review and development of a new Nunavut Parks and Special Places System Plan.

► REGIONAL COORDINATOR, PARK PLANNING & OPERATIONS [Rankin Inlet]

The Kivalliq Regional Coordinator is responsible for coordinating the delivery of Nunavut's Parks and Special Places Program in the Kivalliq region. This includes undertaking feasibility studies, participating in park master/management planning and park operations; identifying and developing parks-based tourism and related economic development opportunities; and undertaking community consultation and fieldwork for the region's Territorial Parks and Canadian Heritage Rivers.

► COORDINATOR, HERITAGE APPRECIATION [Iqaluit]

The Coordinator, Heritage Appreciation will develop and deliver a Nunavut Parks and Special Places Heritage Appreciation Strategy for Nunavut's Territorial Parks and Special Places. This will include leading communications initiatives, developing services-based education and training programs, coordinating community outreach events and activities, curriculum development, and delivering park and special places interpretive planning.



ARE YOU READY FOR THE CHALLENGE?

The knowledge and experience required to be successful in any of these positions would normally be acquired through post-secondary diploma or degree in landscape architecture, environmental planning and design, environmental studies, natural resource management, geography or related field. In addition you must have at least one year of wide ranging experience in coordinating and organizing within one or more natural resource management or environmental planning agencies, specifically including park management planning and related tourism initiatives in a variety of both individual and committee settings. You must have the ability to develop and express ideas and concepts, judgment and recommendations for various audiences verbally, in written form, and graphically.
