UNBC Undergraduate Admission Requirements:

Minimum Requirement:

- Caribbean Examination Council: a minimum of two CAPE two-unit courses and three CSEC courses with a minimum average grade of IV (D) for general entry. Each CAPE course presented must have a minimum of IV.
- GCE: a minimum of two Advanced (A) level subjects and three Ordinary (O) level subjects, must be completed with an overall grade point average of C or higher in order to be considered for admission. All A level subjects presented for admission must have a grade of at least C. Students may substitute two Advanced-Subsidiary (AS) level subjects for one A-level.

Transfer Applicants:

• To be considered a transfer student, a minimum of 15 credit hours of acceptable university-level course work from a recognized post-secondary institution. Please ensure to provide your school's grade scale. Please see: https://www.unbc.ca/registrar/transfer-credit-definitions
