<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> Coursework in the areas of Canadian Studies, Cultural Studies, Asian Studies, Gender and Women's Studies, Indigenous Studies, Religious Studies (of a non-doctrinal nature), Classical Studies, Urban Studies, or Environmental Sciences may be considered provided an examination of the course syllabi reveals such a relationship. Approval must be sought from both the British Columbia Ministry of Education, Teacher Certification Branch, and the UNBC School of Education.
