

The Lower Skeena River and Chatham Sound are seldom explored areas of Northwest BC, where only a few residents – who you will have a chance to meet – inhabit the area which has a rich history that you will experience firsthand. With a 10-guest maximum, this trip offers a personal and authentic experience, perfect for adventurers seeking that memorable experience or photographers wanting to capture the perfect moment.

Highlights include:

- **Port Essington** – Eerie remnants of the local cemetery, boardwalk and Butcher George Frizzel's "Boneyard."
- **Osland** – Icelandic fishing village surrounded by unique relics and nearby canneries surrounded by old pilings.
- **Cannery Row** – At one time had the highest concentration of canneries in the region; home to the North Pacific Cannery National Historic Site, derelict fishing boats, and Cassiar Cannery.
- **Porcher Island** – Visit Porcher Island Cannery and Gillnet Station to explore buildings from the 1920's which overlook the Pacific Ocean and Humpback Bay. and legendary boat-building community of Oona River. Explore old boats, boathouses, relics and the "Rainbow House"
- **Oona River** – Legendary boat-building community for you to explore old boats, boat-houses, relics, and the "Rainbow House". Also

meet a local resident and hear their personal experience of living in Oona River.

- **Cannery stops:** Balmoral, Carlisle, Cassiar, Claxton, Haysport, North Pacific, Porcher Island, Port Essington, Dominion, Sunnyside, Inverness and Oceanic.


