

## Emily Carr Summer Studio for Teens

Especially suited to teens with an interest in community planning, architecture, mapping, drawing, and design, students in these studios will be engaged in collaborative, community research.

This studio presents a unique opportunity for youth to work with faculty from Emily Carr University for two weeks in the summer. The content is specific to the Prince George region, and introduces sketching, technical drawing, design thinking, and exploration of site – fundamental skills for work in the creative field. Intensive research and work in the community will inform a collaborative project that is shared with the public at the end of the program.

### Schedule

This program runs for two weeks, Monday – Friday from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. Students will work with two core faculty throughout the program, and with a number of guest mentors and local experts. Site visits and field trips will augment work undertaken in the studio.

### Cost

Early bird, until April 11, 2014: \$1500, includes basic supplies and \$150 campus food voucher

Regular, after April 11, 2014: \$1500 includes basic supplies

Registration fee includes instruction, field trip costs, and a kit of basic supplies  
Students should expect to spend up to \$100 on additional supplies and project materials

### Core Learning Outcomes

Core learning outcomes are intended to prepare students for future studies in the creative and planning sectors – art, design, architecture, planning and geography. The studios embed local expertise, content and exploration of site as critical elements for understanding place. At the end of this studio, students will:

- have developed a rich sketchbook of diagrammatic, technical and gestural drawing
- be able to utilize design strategies for creative problem solving
- understand how to conduct research and capture information about a site during field studies
- be well-equipped to work collaboratively with peers
- have both process work and finished work that is ready for a portfolio
- gain an awareness of pathways through which they may continue to work towards post-secondary education or employment in a creative field
