Occupational Health and Safety is a specialized field that focuses on the health and safety needs of employees and the impact of the workplace on the environment. Industry, government, First Nations, and businesses require professionals who can anticipate, assess, and communicate risks, as well as develop programs designed to improve health in the work environment. In this program, students will acquire the necessary skills to work within this demanding field. Students who successfully complete all course and program requirements will receive a Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety from UNBC Continuing Studies. The Certificate in Occupational Health and Safety program runs from Sept until June. Courses are scheduled in short intensive sessions with time in between for the completion of course assignments and projects. Students should be prepared to commit their full schedule during the intensive sessions to allow for group assignments, readings, and other preparations

Introduction to Occupational Health and Safety This course provides an overview of the Occupational Health and Safety field and discusses how health and safety relate to an organization's overall management system. Students will be introduced to topics such as leadership commitment, open communication, and legal accountability as core concepts that form the basis for effective safety programs. Project Planning and Cost Management This course focuses on the processes involved in initiating a project including selection, definition of the project scale, scope and complexity, resource planning and allocation as well as scheduling and cost management. Students will learn approaches to project scheduling, project cost management, and to manage change in terms of project scale, scope, complexity, resources and cost. Project Teams, Development and Communication A successful project depends upon the contribution of a number of team members and stakeholders including the Occupational Health and Safety Manager. This course will introduce students to the roles and responsibilities of the Occupational Health and Safety manager, members of the project team, and stakeholders as well as methods to communicate effectively and responsibly to all partners based on their individual information needs.
