**Preparations for Field Camp 2023**

Hi Guys; Just a quick update on camp. Remember we meet Monday, August 21<sup>st</sup> at 0900am in room 5-154 at the UNBC Prince George campus. We will have a brief introduction to field camp there and break into field teams for the duration of camp.

We will be in the Prince George / Aleza Lake area for the first 4 days of camp. During the four days in PG you will need to bring brown bag lunches/drinks. You will be home in PG each night and need to take care of your own breakfast and supper on those days as well, although I am working on a plan to be at the Guide Outfitter Camp for a couple of those nights. We head to the John Prince Research Forest on Friday the 25<sup>th</sup> - where we will be for the rest of the camp and all your food will be provided. We return to the PG campus on Friday September 1<sup>st</sup> around 5pm.

Personal vehicles cannot be brought to the field during camp. If you need to buy a parking pass for your vehicle while you are at camp, you can contact Parking Services (960-5535) who can sell you a pass for the time you are away. Please buy these passes prior to showing up to camp since we will not have time to wait for you to do so once camp begins. Most students figure out rides, so as not to have to leave cars at UNBC.

Because the weather is always unpredictable, I would advise bringing a change of shirts and undergarments for each day we are away; the lack of laundry facilities at the John Prince makes it difficult for people to wash and dry all the clothes that need to be dried. Don't forget to bring insect repellent, your meds and an epipen if you are allergic to wasps/bee stings. Bring a favorite water bottle/coffee mug. Ear plugs are invaluable when bunking with others. Remember if you have any food allergies/special requirements, please send me a special email with food requirements in the subject field if you have not included it on your first assignment (Due July 30<sup>th</sup> so don't forget). Don't forget your favorite treats, fishing poles, ukulele, camera, frisbee, etc. Please ensure you can fit all your gear into 1 large or 2 medium-sized Rubbermaid tubs or duffle bags.
