1. Approval of Agenda

- Motion to approve agenda (K Wilkening/A Fredeen); motion carried with the following additions:

- Motion to approve July 15 minutes (K Aben/K Wilkening); motioned carried with the following revisions:

NEW BUSINESS:

3. Green Fund

- a) Updates (information) K Wilkening
 - 2 Green Fund project reports have been submitted to the Green Fund Subcommittee: Residence and PGPIRG

- The Residence report was somewhat incomplete; while the PGPIRG report was exemplary
- One member suggested that perhaps the groups require a set of guidelines for submitting final reports
- The question was raised whether or not the GUPC would like to receive the reports
- The committee feels that reports should be sent to the GUPC for informational purposes

ACTION: D Smyth will provide the GUPC with the two reports and all other Green Fund reports from future projects.

The reports will be valuable in archiving and promoting Green Fund projects

b) Compost workshop presentation (action) - S Boyd Noel, D Smyth

- A revised Compost Workshop plan was presented
- The workshop will now be co-organized by PGPIRG and the Green University Centre and will consist of a full day divided into two parts:
 - 1. AM: Expert Presentations provide background information for participants
 - PM: Facilitated interactive session to exchange ideas through a World Café format.
- Following the workshop the facilitator will prepare a set of recommendations based on feedback and results
- The workshop co-organizers will present the recommendations to the GUPC and the UNBC Facilities Department.
- The results will also be shared with the broader UNBC community.
- The committee made a number of suggestions including:
 - Extend the length of the expert presentations and drop the UNBC Compost tour
 - Increase the time for questions
 - Possibly request that the presenters stay to present as a panel at the NRESi lecture the next day; Friday November 25, 2011

ACTION: A Fredeen to inquire about NRESI colloquium opening and possibility to have compost experts present.

- One member asked what commitment exists from UNBC to act on the recommendations that will come out of the workshop
- It was determined that the results and recommendations will be presented to the GUPC and the Facilities Department; it is the hope of the workshop organizers that the recommendations will be acted upon
- There were concerns that students might not be able to attend the full session due to class schedules; the organizers clarified that participants will be able to come and go as their schedules permit
- It was suggested that the President be invited
- It was also suggested that compost solutions that incorporate the use of waste heat from Bioenergy be considered
- The committee commended the co-organizers for meeting the conditions and doing an exemplary job

MOTION: To approve funding the proposal titled "Establishing a Vision for the PGPIRG-UNBC Compost Program – Building on Successes and Partnerships" for the amount of \$5000. (K Wilkening/K Aben). Carried.

c) Geodesic Dome Update (information) – C Bell

- SGU has completed a reworked budget for the dome project; all other conditions have been delegated to various individuals
- SGU requested suggestions for managing funds and indicated that they are still seeking an additional \$2000 in funding for the project; they plan to fundraise or seek additional donations (i.e. PICS)
- 2 funds will need to be set up in the end 1) Building/Construction 2) Operations
- SGU will be establishing a Greenhouse Advisory Committee with representation from various departments at UNBC (i.e. Facilities, Purchasing, Green University Centre)
- SGU will present the final conditions to the GUPC before December 2011

4. Report from Green Teaching Subcommittee – K Wilkening

- The Green Teaching Subcommittee (GTSC) was officially formed in March 2011
- The GTSC met for the first time on September 7
- Membership includes 8 faculty 4 from each College
 It was expressed that the GTSC was originally "to catalogue, evaluate, inventory of the
 sustainability content of academic programs at UNBC"; this statement indicates that the
 role of the GTSC is very STARS focused.
- One member asked what the GUPC's understanding was of how the GTSC would function?
- All members in attendance agreed that they envisioned the GTSC to start with STARS and then focus on other broader initiatives
- One member stated that the GTSC should play a role in supporting faculty who are interested in sustainability; keep UNBC engaged with broader provincial initiatives (i.e. goBEYOND, SEAP, etc.)
- It was also noted that a Green Teaching Working Group already exists; this small group
 of two faculty, one staff and one student was formed following a Sustainability Education
 Across the Province (SEAP) workshop in May 2010; the group organized a workshop
 during the 2010 UNBC Teaching and Learning Conference and arrange for the VP
 Sustainability with Sears Canada to visit UNBC in October 2010.
- There are two groups focused on green teaching one informal and one formal; it was
 expressed that both structures are good but it is necessary to determine how both will
 interact.
- The next GTSC meeting will be focused on clarifying the relationship between STARS and the GTSC and how both groups will work together.
- One member inquired about student representation on the GTSC
- It was noted that, Yes, a student position will be included on the GTSC

5. Sustainability Plan Working Group (discussion) – D Smyth

- The Sustainability Plan Working Group was established in March 2011 "to provide feedback from the broader University community for input to "green" aspects of the University plan"
- The SPWG has two members currently: D Smyth and K Wilkening
- It was noted that as a working group the SPWG is meant to disband at some point in time; the question was raised whether or not this is appropriate since sustainability planning will be an on-going process
- The GUPC was reminded that during our July 2011 meeting the SPWG was tasked with suggesting a definition of sustainability to the GUPC.
- It was suggested that any definition of sustainability should be developed with broad public consultation to ensure that feedback from the campus community is reflected.
- The topics of membership on the SPWG, structure as a working group vs a subcommittee and role of the SPWG require further discussion.

6. Grad Student Representative on GUPC - D Smyth

The previous Graduate Student Representative has resigned

 The Graduate Student Society is currently developing a Green Representative on the GSS Council; once this position is filled this representative will be appointed to the GUPC.

7. Alumni Representative (discussion) – D Smyth

The Alumni Association would like to have a representative on the GUPC

ACTION: D Smyth to develop a written submission to the GUPC that includes a description of what an Alumni Representative position might look like. D Smyth will also investigate whether the GUPC TOR requires a vote to amend and create a new position.

8. Roundtable (information) – All members

- PICS Director on campus September 22
- Electric Car vehicle proposal in progress with UNBC and two other organizations
- Barkerville Carbon Footrpint Project underway with PICS
- Carbon Neutrality Subcommittee has not been formed yet; UNBC will be hiring a thirdparty group to collect SMARTool data however the CNSC could still complete the Carbon Neutral Action Report (as per our requirements under the GHG Reductions Targets Act)
- The University Farmers' Market has been launched weekly every Tuesday during the fall semester and bi-weekly during the winter semester
- Active Minds Green Module was very well received; congratulations to A Fredeen and N Nowak for their efforts on developing this module
- Green Day Sub-committee is seeking membership
- Compost Coordinator position has been posted
- Good Food Box will start October 15
- Eggs are on sale in the PGPIRG office on Wednesdays and the garden has produce that students are welcome to take
- Energy and Idle Free policies are on the next agenda for PC
- Residence Energy Challenge begins in November
- Student Sustainability Coordinator position deadline has closed; candidates will be interviewed next week
