NEW BUSINESS:

- **3.** GUPC Terms of Reference K Gaudreau
 - A Lautensach and G deRuiter Starting the conversation around divestment at UNBC
 - E Harrison Important to have a Chair who can regularly attend meetings.

- E Harrison Possible benefits of hosting GUPC meetings in a public forum to better communicate out to the campus (students, faculty and staff).
 - Other avenues including inviting specific groups to come to a GUPC meeting, and hosting open cafes (e.g. 'Connecting you cafes') once per term.
- K Wilkening & A Drew Strength of current GUPC membership is that it balances the "top-down" and "bottom-up" dynamics. It is important to have higher-up administrative persons at the GUPC.
- E Bray Larger committees are less effective. Would like GUPC to maintain current size and would like to see the GUPC playing a more integrated role with academic planning with new Provost.
- R van Adrichem Re-evaluate how much planning the GUPC does. Potentially change the name of the GUPC to simply the "Green Committee" or the "Green University Committee"
- K Gaudreau identify important themes for each given year promote strong focus moving forward into 2015.
- K Gaudreau Important to consider who the GUPC is advising. The target audience is currently unclear.
- K Kieta UNBC sustainability is a distinctive part of the student experience.
 Important to capitalize on this experience.
- A Drew The GUPC could better coordinate with and guide subcommittees and working groups. The GUPC would then serve as an information sharing group of the subcommittees.
