Congratulations to Yanjie Cheng (PhD NRES, May 2010, supervisors: **Youmin Tang** and **Peter Jackson**), who was awarded the Tertia M. C. Hughes Memorial Graduate Student Prize for 2010 by Canadian Meteorological and Oceanographic Society. There are no more than two recipients each year for this award, selected from all graduates majoring in oceanic and atmospheric sciences in Canada. Yanjie is the only a recipient this year.

The award consists of a certificate with the following citation: "To Yanjie Cheng, for his outstanding Ph. D. dissertation at the University of Northern British Columbia, which led to five refereed publications in top-tier journals. Each paper addressed the very challenging and important issue of ENSO (El Nino/Southern Oscillation) prediction and predictability."

Theo Mlynowski, NRES MSc candidate, Geography (supervisor: **Brian Menounos**) received a \$1,000 graduate student grant from the Geological Society of America for his proposed thesis project, "The relation of glacier activity to sediment yield in a proglacial lake, Peyto Basin, Alberta".
