Global warming caused by human activities is happening and presents a serious challenge to society. But in that challenge lies an opportunity to do things better, to unleash a new era of creativity, to improve the stewardship of our natural environment, and to revitalize our economy by generating new, cleaner activity.

This lecture will describe the role PICS is now playing in contributing to BC's response to the climate challenge and place it within the larger North American context. 'Solutions'-based case studies that span both the science-policy intersection and large geographic scales will be presented.

Finally, it is increasingly clear that Canada could take steps that would simultaneously allow us to reduce carbon emissions, while yielding significant new economic value. Getting there will require recognition by the Canadian public and our politicians of both need and opportunity.
