

Empire of the Beetle: How Human Folly and a Tiny Bug are Killing North America's Great Forests

From the late 1980s onwards, the bark beetle — an insect the size of a rice kernel — killed more than 30 billion pine and spruce trees from Alaska to New Mexico. Award-winning journalist Andrew Nikiforuk explains how misguided science, out-of-control logging, bad public policy and a hundred years of fire suppression created a volatile geography that, with the advance of global warming, released the world's oldest forest manager from its natural constraints. He uses first-hand accounts and interviews with entomologists, botanists, and rural residents to understand the real causes behind the epidemic.
