back from Iran and Turkey. He chaired one of the plenary sessions and presented a paper at the International Conference on Human Impacts on Soil Quality Attributes held at Isfahan University of Tech-

nology in Isfahan, Iran. He also spent some time with colleagues at the Department of Soil Science and Archaeometry, Cukurova University in Turkey. They collected rock, soil and archaeological samples from red soils and the ruins of the Neo-lithic, Hitite, Roman and Byzantine settlements along the Mediterranean sea and the central Anatolian regions

in Turkey. They would like to establish the extent of agricultural practices in the Catalhoyuk site (ca. 7,400 BC) and to understand the phosphorus cycling in soils that has been under cultivation for thousands of years.

- Staffan Lindgren was invited to give a keynote speech on "Use of Pheromones in Forestry with Special Reference to Mountain Pine Beetle Management" at the Ninth Annual Integrated Forest Pest Management Meeting, Edmonton, AB, October 7, 2005.
- With generous help from colleagues (Lito, Peter, Mohamed and Staffan) and support from Geography (Gail) **Kevin Hall** will leave for his 12th Antarctic expedition to work at Terra Nova Bay (75degS) on the edge of the polar ice cap with the Italian National Antarctic program until December. • David Connell, Assistant Professor, School of Environmental Planning, attended the annual conference of the Communal Studies Association (CSA) held September 29 to October 1. The conference was held in the historic communal settlements of Harmony and Economy in Pennsylvania, which were founded by the Harmonist Society in 1805. The CSA provides a forum for the study of intentional communities, past and present. David presented the initial results of his research on the shared practices of growing food and sharing meals by members of contemporary intentional communities.
