GRE Tests

- There are two tests you have to take, depending on the institution you choose to apply to.
- The general and the subject test

Registration

- There are three ways to register
- Web: through the Gre website (credit card)
- Phone: Monday through Friday 8am-8pm
 - 1-800-GRE-CALL
 - (1-800-473-2255).

Registration cont.

- Mail: get authorization voucher off the GRE website, and send to address on voucher with appropriate amount of money. Usually takes up to four weeks.
- Keep in mind when registering that you have to register at least a month ahead of the date you would like to write the test.

GRE Subject Test

- You should receive your results in 4- 6 weeks after writing the test.
- You get 4 free reports to send to Universities that you must pick when you register, each additional one is 15\$

The GRE General

- Your results will be mailed out to you 10-15 days after writing the test
- You get 4 free reports to send to Universities that you register for after exam.

Alternate Testing Centers

- If you are more then 125 miles from nearest test station for the paper based General or Subject test you can apply to take the test at a nearer place, you must:
- be received by the special registration deadline for the <u>General Test</u> or the <u>Subject Test</u>
- include the name and complete address of an institution and staff member willing to administer the test
- indicate if you would prefer another test date or a refund since centers cannot be guaranteed
- explain why the available test centers are not suitable. (www.gre.org)

- Online registration only (credit card)
- GRE Subject Test only available : November, December, and April.

- Analytical Writing
- *articulate complex ideas clearly and effectively

Verbal Reasoning

- *analyze and evaluate written material and synthesize information obtained from it
- *analyze relationships among component parts of sentences
- *recognize relationships between words and concepts.(www.gre.org)

- Antonyms: pick the word most nearly opposite to the bolded word.
- Amicable (a) Penetrating (b) Compensating
 (c) Unfriendly (d) Zigzag (e) Inescapable

Answer: c

Quantitative Reasoning

- *understand basic concepts of arithmetic, algebra, geometry, and data analysis
- *reason quantitatively (www.gre.org)

Example of These Kind of Questions

- If a + 2b = 14 and 5a + 4b = 16, what is the average (arithmetic mean) of a and b?
- (a) 1.5 (b) 2 (c) 2.5 (d) 3 (e) 3.5
- Answer: 2.5
