

Research in Technology Fellowship (RTF) – An industry Sponsored Research and Work Experience Opportunity for UNBC Students

Application Deadline: November 15, 2020

About: The Research in Technology Fellowship was established to provide Research and Development (R&D) opportunities for UNBC students in any discipline who are interested in technology related research. This is an opportunity for students to be involved in a combination of research and internship activities where they will earn valuable experience while working with Research Engineers from TeejLab. It also provides an opportunity for faculty members to mentor UNBC students in areas of technology related research.

This fellowship is co-sponsored by UNBC and TeejLab Inc. and each application should demonstrate how the student researcher will address an industry challenge related to cybersecurity, technology, data privacy, security, and integrity.

Research activities may include (but are not limited to) working on research design; data collection; data analysis; participation in the production of a creative work informed by research. Two fellowships of \$5,000 each will be provided to the successful students for the term of December 7th, 2020–August 27th, 2021. However, this time period can be flexible to accommodate COVID-19 related restrictions and will be negotiated with the successful applicant.

Eligibility: This competition is open to all upper level UNBC undergraduate or graduate students who are interested in pursuing R&D in the areas of data privacy, security, and integrity. Applicants must be supported by a faculty mentor.

As part of this fellowship there is an opportunity for the successful candidate to complete a 4 month paid work term in Vancouver¹ funded directly by TeejLab during the term of the fellowship. Support for travel costs up to a limited amount will be available. See guidelines for further details.

Please note that a student can only receive the RTF once in their academic career.

- At the end of the fellowship, the student will commit to providing a short 2–3 page report on the research activities they engaged in, included title and abstract (max. 200 words), outcomes of the project, and assessment of the experience.
- In their assessment of the experience, students are encouraged to reflect on their learning and in particular are asked to respond to the following questions:
 - 1. Did the experience enhance your research skills? Please explain.
 - 2. Did the experience enhance your understanding of the research process? Please explain.
 - 3. Did the experience enhance your overall educational experience at UNBC? Please explain.
