The Department of Global and International Studies at UNBC invites applications for a Part-time French Instructor for the 2019-2020 academic year to teach four language courses and supervise student assistants who conduct the lab classes. Two courses will be at the introductory level and two will be at the intermediate level.

The position begins in September 2019.

Qualifications: Applicants with a Master's or Doctoral level qualifications relevant to the position and who have experience in teaching French at the post-secondary level are preferred. Applicants must have a Canadian visa that permits work in Canada. The successful applicant should have native or near native fluency in French and English.
