8. <u>TEACHING</u>

Areas of interest include home and community care nursing, wound care, palliative care, geriatric health, and chronic conditions. Prior experience in theory, clinical, and lab instruction. Teaching approaches include lectures, multi-modal presentations, discussion boards, case studies, guest speakers, student-led presentations, OSCAs and OSCEs.

Teaching goals include developing critical thinking, clinical reasoning, and decision-making skills; engagement in self-directed learning and evidence-based practice; and dedication to life-long learning. Students are encouraged to work collaboratively in interdisciplinary teams and provide culturally safe and trauma-informed patient- and family-centred care. Strategies include hands-on practice, situational learning, "teach back" approach, concept-mapping, sharing experiences, discussing cases, and linking theory and research to practice.

Primary clinical focus includes community health nursing, with emphasis on home and community care. Research skills developed during MScN program and thesis work include using institutional ethnographic methodology, incorporating patient-oriented research, and conducting integrative literature reviews. Skills developed during research assistant roles include: (1) using Hermeneutic lens, engaging in patient-oriented research, and undergoing a systematic literature search for rapid realist review; (2) contributing to CASN Report for NCBNP; (3) contributing to BCCNM Report for MScN-FNP program; (4) engaging in environmental scan, focus group

organization, and strategic planning sessions for nursing admission, recruitment, and retention work; and (5) curriculum review and transition to One45 for the MScN-FNP program.

Future research interests include: exploring the structures and systems that organize institutions and how these influence individuals who live and work within those structures, with a specific focus on navigating the healthcare system; patient- and family-centred care, therapeutic relationships, and roles of patients and families in care; student learning experiences; and nursing admissions, recruitment, and retention in northern BC.
