### **Course Notes**

- This is a guide only, coursework (i.e. ANTH off list requirement offerings and many upper division ANTH courses) will vary each year in the semester they are offered. Spaces with Elective can be swapped out with required courses if offerings better match interest.
- Students should consult the Undergraduate Calendar for course descriptions and pre/corequisites.
- Not sure what to do with your electives? A Minor is a great way to concentrate your electives. Talk with your Student Advisor for suggestions!
- Residency Requirement: Students must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours of upper division course work at UNBC to receive a UNBC degree.
- Time Limit: Except by permission of the Dean, students must complete their undergraduate degree program within 15 years of their first semester of registration.

**TRANSFER & RETURNING STUDENTS:** Please consult with your Student Advisor to determine how your previous work may best be applied to the program requirements. When registering for coursework pay close attention to the course preclusions to ensure you are not registering in duplicate coursework.

**DEGREE EVALUATIONS:** The <u>Degree Evaluation</u> is an interpretation of the Undergraduate Calendar for the year that you were admitted and helps display the requirements needed for your program.

**HONOURS**: Students with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.33 can apply for Honours after 60 credit hours of study including completion all of the lower division Anthropology requirements. Students will also be required to submit a written application to the Program Chair that identifies the sub-discipline of interest, provides a statement of career objectives, and includes an unofficial copy of their current transcript.

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
