STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO USE THEIR DEGREE EVALUATION FOR YEAR 2, YEAR 3 and YEAR 4 COURSE PROGRESSION PLANNING.

Course Notes

- These courses need not necessarily be taken in the sequence as indicated. We strongly recommend completing lower division requirements in the first two years of the program.
- Students should consult with the Undergraduate Calendar for course descriptions and pre/corequisites.
- Students interested in Research Methods in First Nations (FNST 300) should use an elective in year two to take the pre-requisite (FNST 200).
- ENPL 415 and ENPL 417 are normally offered in alternating years (Fall). Students should try to take these classes when offered.
- ENPL 411 is normally offered in the Fall of odd years. Students take this course as soon as fall of 3rd year.
- ENPL 404 is offered every Even Year Winter.
 Students should take this course as soon as Winter of their 3rd year.
- For the past few years, POLS 350 has been offered in the summer every two years (condensed, two-month format). Students should try to take this class when offered.
- Students can apply for a <u>Student Membership in</u> the Planning Institute of British Columbia.

DEGREE EVALUATIONS: The <u>Degree Evaluation</u> is an interpretation of the Undergraduate Calendar for the year that you were admitted and helps display the requirements needed for your program.

DOUBLE MAJORS: Students who are considering a double major should speak with their Student Advisor as soon as possible. Note, BPI students are permitted to double major only within their degree program.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT: Students must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours of upper division UNBC course work to receive a UNBC degree.

TIME LIMIT: Except by permission of the Dean, students must complete their undergraduate degree program within 15 years of their first semester of registration.
