The Anthropology Program follows the style format of the Society for American Archaeology (SAA), as used in the journal *American Antiquity*. This is an in text citation format as displayed in the example below.

Text example:

Recent results from butchering experiments with stone tool have shown that unretouched flakes are capable of piercing through elephant hide (Smith 1999:312).

In the bibliography this would be cited as:

Smith, Erasmus

In the bibliography:

For journal articles, italicize or underline journal title:

Smith, J. and B. Hunter,

Winter temperatures and attendance in university classes in Prince George, B.C. *Journal of Interesting Educational Trivia* 65: 23-34.

For chapters in books, italicize or underline book title:

Ford, S.

2000 How to annoy your friends and win debates. In: *The Fine Art of the Argument*, edited by I.B. Silly and I.M. Not, pp. 165-172. The Very Big Press Corporation, Los Angeles.

For books, italicize or underline book title:

Banana, B. C.,

2009 Fruits for Your Pleasure. Grapevine Press, London.

For web page:

Marston, H.K.
