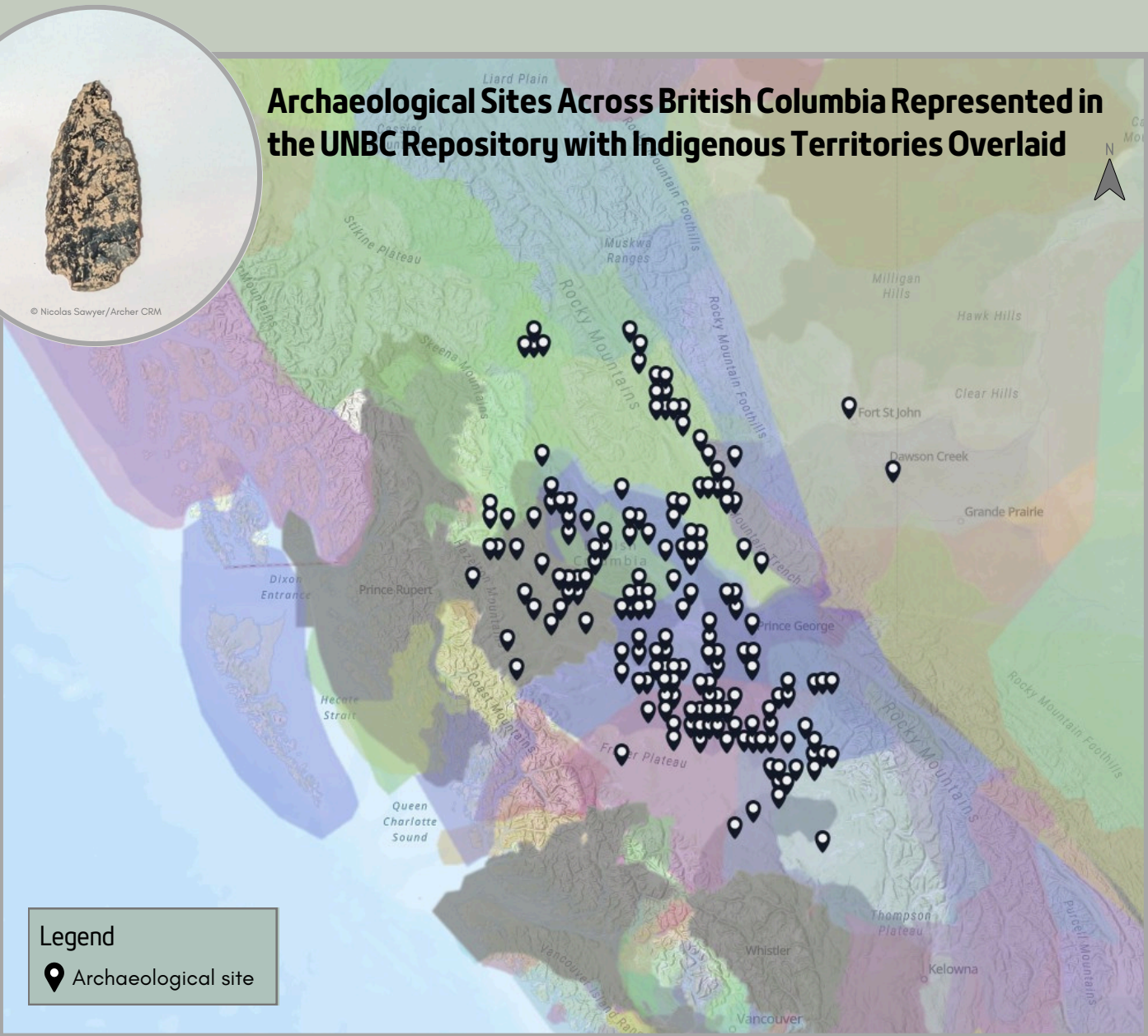


ARCHAEOLOGY AT UNBC:

Information about the repository


The University of Northern British Columbia archaeological repository houses a variety of archaeological materials. These materials span a wide range of the province and are encompassed in each of the three culture regions. The repository acts as a storage facility for the distinct materials recovered during archaeological field work from 1999 until present.





79 Projects

Each project across B.C. is unique and encompasses multiple Borden codes and in some instances dozens of sites.




The Northwest Coast, Interior Plateau and Subarctic Boreal Forest Culture Regions are all highlighted in the repository.

23 Communities

The archaeological materials found have ties to 23 distinct Indigenous Communities across B.C. including the local Lheidli T'enneh, D  n  ndeh & Dak  t Keyoh.



The artifacts range from stone tool lithics (e.g., debitage, flakes etc.), ecofacts, faunal remains & historic artifacts covered in the Heritage Conservation Act.
