Project Management Fundamentals (Module 1)

In the first module of the Masters Certificate in Project Management, students discover useful project management strategies to help boost their career. The course covers everything from establishing project frameworks to developing realistic project budgets, providing learners with the building blocks to become a project management professional.

Business Requirements, Project Validation and Quality Management (Module 2)

In Module 2, students discover how business requirements underpin every project and the critical role such requirements play in project quality management. The course teaches learners how to use project management essentials to build a product from the very inception of the project.

Project Leadership and Team Building (Module 3)

The Project Leadership and Team Building module challenges learners' views of the project manager and teaches the concepts of project leadership. Students learn that most project work is completed through the efforts of teams; thus, the more effective your team, the greater your likelihood of project success.

Planning and Control (Module 4)

Module 4 helps learners understand project planning and the necessary steps to monitor and control a project from conceptualization in order to benefit realization. From this module, students discover a systematic process to plan almost any project including a scope, cost, and schedule baseline.

Stakeholder and Communication Management (Module 5)

The fifth module of the Masters Certificate in Project Management teaches students about stakeholder management and methods to meet or exceed project expectations. Expectation management requires a variety of communication methods; therefore, students learn to enhance their communication skills while learning to manage stakeholder engagement more effectively.

Procurement Management, Risk Management and Professional Ethics (Module 6)

For Module 6, students explore the interdependencies between the topics of Procurement, Risk, and Professional Ethics. The course teaches about procurement options to project managers and the importance of effective contract management. Students also learn methods for identifying and prioritizing risks, while also learning about professional ethics and the personal requirements to making ethical decisions.

Change Management (Module 7)

Change Management establishes learners' understanding of project change management and covers how to use change management tools and templates. The course also enhances students' ability to attain and retain stakeholder buy-in.

In-class Simulation/PMP Exam Prep Review (Module 8)

In this module, students conduct a presentation that helps synthesize their learning experience. The purpose of the course project is to help students manage the dynamic nature of projects and use subjective/objective tools to enhance decision-making.

Simulation and Debrief (Module 9)

For Module 9, students apply course lessons to a live project from conception to execution. The class work as a project team, manage stakeholders and project plans and change control, and become fully immersed in the dynamic environment of a complex and time-constrained project.
