

Key Information

- You are now entering your final 4 weeks of classes which will be hosted at UNBC.
 - TekX students will still attend a Human Skills course at CNC every Monday.
- The TekX schedule matches the SD57 high school semester, with a Winter Break from December 23, 2024, to January 3, 2025.
- You will be taking Computer Science 127 Introduction to Technology
 - This course introduces students to a current technological topic, defines technology, and explores the context of technology, prototyping, and testing. Students participate in a project involving remote or autonomous control and use project-based learning to analyze how competing social, ethical, and sustainability considerations influence the creation and development of technological solutions.



Settling in at UNBC

Attendance

UNBC values the role of attendance and active participation in supporting student success. In the TekX program, students are expected to attend each class to achieve the necessary course competencies.

- You must email your UNBC instructor if you will be late or absent, and all communication with instructors must be done through your UNBC email account.
- Frequent lateness or absences will lead to a notification to your high school counselor and may
 result in a recommendation to withdraw from TekX. If you are experiencing difficulties, please contact
 your school counsellor.
- Students are responsible for arranging their own transportation to and from UNBC. All students will
 automatically be given a UPass that gives them access to public transportation and pools. See

UNBC Student Account and Access

UNBC Student Account

As a UNBC dual credit student you are automatically enrolled for a <u>myUNBC student account</u> and classified as an undergraduate student. This account is your go-to hub for UNBC resources such as finances, course planning and student records. Your login will be automatically created, following the format: last name, first initial and a number@unbc.ca.

Activate your UNBC student account

You would have received an email from UNBC ITS about activating your UNBC student account and creating your login password.

Secure your student account with Multi-Factor Authentication

Upon signing into your myUNBC Student Account for the first time, you will be prompted to set up multi-factor authentication (MFA). UNBC has enabled MFA to enhance the level of security and integrity of its digital computer systems. This technology is essential to help reduce fraud and computer-based attacks against UNBC computer systems.

- Use your UNBC student login information to access your email at outlook.office.com
- All contact with your UNBC instructors will go through this email.

• Campus Wi-Fi

- You can connect to UNBC wi-fi in two ways:
 - Connect to Eduroam for access to the UNBC Wi-Fi network. For setup, you'll need your UNBC email address and password.

Northern Sport Centre

UNBC Student Fitness Pass

Access to the Charles Jago Northern Sport Centre (NSC) at UNBC is available to you as a TekX student.

- One of the perks of being a UNBC student is a fitness pass to the Northern Sport Centre. As a Dual Credit student, you are eligible for a 4-month student fitness pass.
- The TekX Student Fitness Pass semester dates are set as follows:
 - Fall Semester Start date: November 1 to End date: February 28

Process for activating your Student Fitness Pass

- Students (if you are under 18, please bring a parent or guardian with you) can visit the NSC front counter to complete the necessary paperwork.
 - You will need to complete the Release of Liability form.
 - The NSC Staff will verify the student's name on the authorized TekX student list and issue the applicable pass.
- If the student does not already have one, a plastic RFID fob must also be purchased for \$10 (includes tax) to check in at the front counter and access the fitness zones.
 - o Note: once purchased, the same fob can be used for future passes and memberships.

The NSC is going into its busy season, parents and students should give themselves extra time when go to the NSC front desk to sign up and fill out the necessary paperwork.

During your time as a UNBC student you will have automatic access to the vast array of library resources available from the Geoffrey R. Weller Library.



Parking and Transportation

UPass

All students are automatically enrolled for a UNBC U-Pass which provides bus service all semester.

You will have the option of downloading the Umo mobile app or obtaining a re-loadable Umo card.
