DESCRIPTION:

With its emphasis on training in aural comprehension and oral production, this course is also designed for students who have studied french previously in an immersion-like situation, allowing them to refresh their language skills and grammar knowledge. (passé-composé/imparfait, conditionnel, subjonctif, futur antérieur, plus-que-parfait)

The course also consists of reading and writing, applying grammar rules in short composition.

During the lab component of the course, students will practice their listening tasks by completing student activity sheets and there will be time for general conversation with the Teaching Assistant.
