1. Update on Master Plan

- Sharon has consulted with the College Councils, Prince George City Council and the Lheidli T'enneh and will be meeting with the Regional District. Sharon is hoping to get feedback on the master plan components and the inclusion of an integrated sustainability plan.
- There will be no development on new Crown-grant lands as the lands are for teaching and learning only.
- There has been some rethinking of the use of the parking lots perhaps future buildings with underground parking.
- The draft Master Plan incorporates sustainability.
- There is a need to strengthen the language for land use from "should" to "must".
- There have been positive comments from the focus groups on energy and landscaping that will be considered in the Master Plan.
- The infrastructure behind all buildings will be examined.

4. Business Arising

The conference CD is not yet on the Green website.

5. Coordinator Position

- This position has been approved by President's Executive Council.
- Discussion ensued including the following comments:
 - Suggested that the Provost Office fund the position for one year and then secure permanent funding thereafter.
 - o The position should be a broad "Institutional" position.
 - o The naming of the position to be consistent with the "Green" initiative.
 - One person should take ownership of the university's "Greening".
 - o Suggested that the position be more of a Director than a Coordinator.
 - Perhaps position could be part of Provost Office (Shannon Barber's position which supported the legalities and policies of special projects). Provost also has staff to support this position.
 - o Position needs to be in a visible location on campus.
 - Position to search for funding from grants for institutions to go "green" and therefore would be able to "pay back" position over time.
 - o Hiring of grad students as support for this position may be possible.
 - Recommended position title could be "Director/Manager of the Green University Initiative".

ACTION: Don Cozzetto to speak to Jim Randall on:

- funding for this position for one year
- determine with the Space Committee, a visible location for this position
- writing of the Position Description
- outcome of this action to be reported at next committee meeting

6. Update on Green University Committee Structure

- This date is the start of the spring break for high school students and recruiters will be on campus and available for tours.
- Planning and responsibilities will be disbursed to different university groups (i.e. NUGSS, PIRG) to be determined at a later date.

8. Report on Community Engagement

- See Report on Public Engagement on Greening the University November 24, 2007 compiled by Annie Booth.
- In summary, those attending the focus groups were supportive of UNBC's efforts to be more green but suggested that greater communication was necessary and that it may be premature to claim that UNBC is "Canada's Green University."
- Main topics commented on were waste production, purchasing, energy, alternative energy services, cafeteria and waste production, alternative transportation, sustainable landscaping and facilities approach to green.
- Essential to have quick acknowledgement of responses to survey (i.e. acknowledge a source from the report and the action to ensue).
- CUPE and Over the Edge can have access to report as it is anonymous.
- UNBC must do more to communicate green successes to university and community.
- New UNBC homepage to include UNBC Green Tips and UNBC Green Facts.
- Annie Booth was thanked for her work on the green survey and report.

ACTION: Rob van Adrichem to create a Green Committee link on Green website to include committee minutes, membership and news.

A Green University newsletter was suggested.

ACTION: Sandra Earle to add a Green component to the bi-weekly UNBC Bulletin, and make UNBC Green University the lead story in the next issue of the Bulletin, November 23, 2007.

9. Message from UNBC's CUPE Representative

 Mark Thompson, Molecular Genetic Support Specialist and Grad Student has received funding to investigate the sustainability of the amphibian population on the lands around UNBC.

10. Residence Recycling Program/Disposable, Non-biodegradable Items on Campus.
