- There are donors willing to support the Residences in purchasing the hovers and compost bins.
- e) For compost program to happen successfully at the Residences, UNBC and the Residences need to:
 - Forecast volume of compost added by Student Residences
 - Design appropriate facilities
 - Cost analysis
 - Environmental impact analysis
 - Analysis of man hours needed to run the new compost program

- Summary of event
- Recommendations for next year:
 - · Bring faculty to talk more about research.
 - There was a lack of awareness of when speakers were on, better communication is needed.
 - Bring in different groups to speak (students, staff, etc).
 - Have brief displays (3-5 minutes) on each table rather than long presentations to better deal with people's limited time.
 - Transfer historical display to a legacy format (PPT).
 - Start earlier and increase consultation.
 - Display Green Fund posters.
 - · Reconsider having project representatives at event.
 - Increase day-of marketing.
 - Timberwolf mascot in Green Day t-shirt, volunteers promoting throughout hallways.

- Consider supplementing UFM table fee to increase participation.
- Recruit more volunteers.
- · Continue using Green Day t-shirts.
