3. Statement of Green Objectives

- B McGill said objectives broken down into 3 spheres economic, environmental, and social. Items are not all fleshed out, welcomed suggestions and additions
- M Dale said document meant to be a starting point. Suggested forwarding comments to recorder for collating
- K Wilkening said some comments may be conflicting so may need more than just compiling
- A Booth suggested making time for discussion at next meeting

ACTION: Committee members asked to provide comments/suggestions on the Green Objectives. Stacey Linton to compile.

4. Draft Self-Study Document

- R van Adrichem highlighted what's been going on over the past 18 months
- S Rennick suggested adding a section called "communications" in the report
- A Booth said much study, but not a lot done. Discouraged that enthusiasm is being lost because of lack of action
- S Rennick replied items are being done, just lack of communication e.g. energy study, energy managers, climate action groups, recycling plan and request for proposal for waste management (closes Nov 10)
- M Dale asked that committee focus on fate of self-study
- R van Adrichem suggested people look especially at the Networks section and provide content

ACTION: Committee members asked to forward comments/suggestions on the Self-Study to Stacey Linton.

- K Wilkening suggested a sub-committee meeting before next full meeting to review self study and objectives
- A Fredeen, A Booth, M Thompson also volunteered to meet

ACTION: Ken Wilkening, Art Fredeen, Annie Booth, and Mark Thompson to meet prior to next committee meeting to discuss green objectives and priorities.

5. Canadian University Report, Globe & Mail

- R van Adrichem said report by students
- Committee expressed disappointment with not being included in this publication

6. Academia's Top Ten

- R van Adrichem said UBC has been very successful in showing how they are good fund a large sustainability project including 2 PR people to show how they are perceived as green
- M Dale proposed idea that we increase parking and use revenue for green projects
- R van Adrichem said we need a forum first to get feedback on priorities
- A Booth stated some not PR. There are explicit programs where people work to be green and make deliberate green choices
- R van Adrichem pointed out buildings are part of the package
- A Booth said need to look at what more we can do, suggested ASSHE
- · G Fondahl asked what is the process for moving green projects and priorities forward.
- M Dale said problem is there is no process to move good ideas into coming into being e.g. surcharge on disposable cups
- E Bray pointed out Bookstore doesn't have plastic bags anymore, has the inexpensive alternative of the pop bag. Need an alternative then could get rid of disposable cups too
- A Fredeen suggested banning disposable cups could be a big media story
- M Thompson said projects need accountability. If going to do an initiative, need monitoring so can chart progress and announce results

7. Partnership of Green Committee with City of Prince George

- B McGill said to consider how committee can associate with the city. City has challenges in being green, can we or should we create more formal relationship?
- S Rennick pointed out city not in charge of solid waste, regional district is. Stated she's not sure city is best use of time, maybe just go to regional district
- L Burke stated that the city has been mandated to become green; they are in the same boat of scrambling to get ideas into being. Suggested if pooled together could get more done
- Ken Wilkening offered to contact Tracy Summerville & Mark Fercho regarding the status of UNBC's involvement with the Integrated Community Sustainability Plan

8. UNBC Travel and Carbon Offset Credits

- G Fondahl stated this will required time and effort in identifying a regional source that people can pay into
- · G Fondahl suggested creating a sub-committee
- K Wilkening suggested PICS (Pacific Institute for Climate Solutions) could be involved with this

9. Nominations to External Environmental Committees

- K Wilkening stated that UNBC people are being nominated to external committees, PG
 Air wants a formal designation of committee members and alternatives from UNBC.
 Pointed out we don't have a mechanism of how UNBC is to appoint anybody. Suggested
 PEC pass policy where PG Air formally requests an appointment, Green Committee to
 review and make recommendation
- G Fondahl likes the idea as it provides transparency. B McGill agreed
- M Dale suggested making a request to the President
