- 3. Recognition of Service for K Wilkening and K Aben All
 - The GUPC wishes to thank Ken Wilkening and Kyle Aben for all their service to the GUPC. We wish them all the best in their new endeavours (Kyle) and sabbatical (Ken).

- **4.** Green Centre Research and Engagement Assistant A Fredeen
 - Proposal from A Booth, A Fredeen, K Gaudreau and K Aben to combine PICS and Green Centre operating funds to hire a Sustainability Research and Engagement Assistant (SRE Assistant) 3 days per week in the Green Centre. Role would take over administrative duties – including event organization, website and social media management, and meeting coordination, etc. – to allow PICS Coordinator and Sustainability Manager time for higher level activities (e.g. teaching, research, broader strategy)
 - SRE Assistant would work 1 day per week on PICS related work and 2 days per week on Sustainability Manager / general duties. Functional supervisor provided by the Sustainability Manager, with oversight and mentorship from PICS and possibly Energy Technician.
 - SRE Assistant would be 2-year pilot, with 1/3 funding provided by PICS. The group is requesting the GUPC endorse allocating \$22,700 from the Green Fund to support the pilot.
 - D Claus Concerns about lack of transparency in the Green Fund budget in previous years. More clarity desired.
 - K Wilkening Important to design a rigorous selection process. Suggests 4-5 member committee with representation from GUPC.
 - D Claus May be worth including the history of the Sustainability Manager position into the proposal.
 - K Kieta SRE Assistant would free up time for Sustainability Manager to better engage with graduate students.
 - Action Item K Gaudreau to circulate amended draft proposal to GUPC for electronic vote.
- 5. Green Fund Proposals All members
 - D Claus Subcommittee met on Wednesday June 17 to consider the Green Fund proposals.
 - Proposals recommended for submission to President's Executive Council for funding, subject to conditions proposed by Green Fund Subcommittee:
 - Thesis reclamation (James MacDonald)
 - Carried (K Gaudreau / K Aben)
 - National food summit (Melanie Anderson)
 - Carried (K Gaudreau / K Aben)
 - Scarlet tide brigade (Sarah Boyd).
 - Carried: Approved up to \$475 based on submission of receipts (G de Ruiter / K Wilkening)
 - Proposals recommended for resubmission based on Subcommittee recommendations
 - Mini-greenhouse project (Kelly Thirkettle)
 D Claus Some logistical issues and uncertainties present in proposal.
 - Carried (K Gaudreau / K Aben)
 - Proposals not recommended by the Green Fund for resubmission
 - Rideshare (Shaun Cormier) Significant risk issues around collecting of personal data.
 - Carried (G de Ruiter / K Kieta)
 - Electric bike (G de Ruiter)
 - D Claus Uncertainty over whether electric bike is the best fit to address the hill as a barrier to cycling.
 - G de Ruiter Concerned that expectations are too high for pre-proposal surveying.

- D Claus Expectations have evolved with time to ensure success of the Green Fund awards. Especially so when relating to assets purchased and managed on campus.
- K Wilkening Approximately 1/3 of proposals are funded. Agree that transportation is gaining interest on campus, and some coordination of activities may be necessary. Need to ensure Green Fund projects do not place burden on others (e.g. Green Centre).
- Motion GUPC to recommend resubmission with condition that management of bike be clearly articulated and supported by the appropriate stakeholders.

- 6. Greenway Green Fund request for additional funding K Gaudreau
 - R Wheate's Greenway Green Fund project over budget due to unforeseen additional costs of mounting the maps. Library and Northern Sports Centre have each contributed \$300. Request for additional \$500 to print a fourth map and refund already committed expenses.
 - K Wilkening Important to ensure Green Fund logo placed on all the maps.
 - Motion GUPC to support request for additional \$500 for the Greenway Green Fund project.
