This document is provided as an opportunity for you to discuss with your roommate(s) specific areas regarding living in residence that roommates frequently come into conflict over. It is our belief that future problems can be diverted if agreements on these potentially high conflict areas are reached early on in the semester.

Communication is essential for a positive, working relationship with your roommate(s). To facilitate this process, it is important to address potential "problem" areas. Please use the following document in this matter:

- 1. Respond to each question with your own preference, each roommate individually.
- 2. Examine and discuss the differences with your roommate(s).
- 3. Try to agree on a way to resolve those differences now, **before** conflicts arise, in a manner that will be satisfactory to **all** of you. This may involve compromise, so please be open and flexible, yet assertive about your own needs.

We hope that by discussing the questions in this document, you and your roommate(s) will begin to develop the kind of relationship that is conducive to positive academic, community and personal growth. We also hope that this process will eliminate or lessen the possibility of conflict and increase the amount of communication between you and your roommate(s).

1. Community/Personal Property
