### 7-point grading scale:

Danish mark	Explanation of the mark	Equivalent ECTS mark
12	Is given for an excellent performance, displaying a high level of command of all aspects of the relevant material with no or only a few minor weaknesses	A
10	Is given for a very good performance, displaying a high level of command of most aspects of the relevant material with only minor weaknesses	В
7	Is given for a good performance, displaying good command of the relevant material and some weaknesses	С
4	Is given for a fair performance, displaying some command of the relevant material but also some major weaknesses	D
02	Is given for a performance meeting only the minimum requirements for acceptance (Lowest passing grade)	E
