Guidelines for Retiring Faculty on Donating Material to the Library and Northern BC Archives

Retiring faculty members are encouraged to check with the UNBC Library and Archives regarding the disposition of their books and papers/manuscripts. Faculty collections contribute significantly to the strength of the Geoffrey R. Weller Library and Northern British Columbia Archives & Special Collections. Your collections have the potential to provide valuable information to future researchers on both your personal research topics and the history of UNBC.

Donation is simple and a professional librarian or archivist is available to help you.

Books

A professional librarian will evaluate books to determine if they are desired for the general collection. In most cases, donors will be required to provide a list of the material being offered. A gift of books may qualify as a charitable donation for income tax purposes, although materials acquired with government funds (e.g. through university research grants, professional development allowances) are not considered personal property, and are ineligible for a tax receipt. Materials received free by the donor, including complimentary desk or review copies, are also ineligible for a tax receipt. In addition, a qualified appraiser must evaluate proposed donations whose value is likely to be in excess of \$1000.
