#### **FUNDING ANNOUCEMENT**

From Ranjana Bird, VP Research:

UNBC's Integrated Watershed Research Group (IWRG) has recently been awarded a four year grant for research in the Nechako River basin. The proposal from the four UNBC faculty (Petticrew, Owens, Parkes and Déry) was approved and funding awarded from the Nechako Environmental Enhancement Fund (NEEF). This four year, 1M\$ project will focus on integrating aspects of water security in a changing climate, riverine fine sediment sources and tools for integration to inform watershed governance in the Nechako watershed. The 0.5M\$ awarded from NEEF will be matched with funding secured by the IWRG members.

Please join us on Friday May 23rd at 11am in the Atrium of the UNBC Administration building to help us celebrate this research award and collaborative project.
