#### "STRUCTURE, ASSEMBLY AND FUNCTION OF TYPE IV PILI FROM BACTERIAL PATHOGENS"

The Type IV pili are filaments on the surfaces of many Gram-negative bacteria that mediate an extraordinary array of functions, including adhesion, motility, microcolony formation and secretion of proteases and colonization factors. Their prominent display on the surfaces of many bacterial pathogens, their vital role in virulence, and their ability to elicit an immune response make Type IV pilus structures particularly relevant for study as targets for component vaccines and therapies. We have employed a variety of structural and genetic techniques to understand the molecular architecture of these pili and how they perform their diverse functions.
