# **TRAVELING**

- Paul Sanborn will be attending the meeting of the Association of University Forestry Schools in Canada in Edmonton on Oct. 1<sup>st</sup>.
- ◆ Kathy Lewis will attend the CIF-SAF conference in Edmonton to present an invited paper. The conference is Oct. 2-6. The title of her paper is: "Pathogens and their influence on fire risk and severity in boreal and sub-boreal forests of Canada: Pandora's box or pipe dream?"
- Kathy Lewis was in Kelowna on September 29 and 30 for a Forest Appeals Commission hearing.
- A group of forestry students will be traveling to Edmonton to attend the joint meetings of the Canadian Institute of Forestry and the Society of American Foresters from October 3-6. This joint meeting of the major forestry professional associations in North America only takes place every five years, and it is expected that more than 200 forestry students from Canada and the United States will be in attendance. The trip is being funded by a grant from the Canadian Institute of Forestry and UNBC's Ecosystem Science and Management program. Drs. Scott Green and Kathy Lewis will be UNBC faculty supervisors during the trip.
