Funding Options

- Scholarships & Bursaries: Entrance and continuing awards.
- Indigenous Awards: Bursaries and scholarships for First Nations, Métis, and Inuit students.
- Nation or Band Funding: Support for tuition, books, and living expenses.
- Government Supports: Including tuition waivers for former youth in care.
- External Opportunities: Funding from Indigenous organizations and governments.
