### **Spanish Mountain Gold**

On February 16th, over 60 people attended a community meeting Spanish about the Mountain Gold (SMG) mine project. Although the start date is not set, SMG is hoping to start construction mine 2014. However, this date start rests on different factors including: permitting, provincial and federal approvals, commodity prices, etc. Considering all of these factors, the project could begin as early as 2014 or as late as 2020.

The project is in the

advanced exploration stage, but still needs to go through the prefeasibility and feasibility studies that will look at different engineering options for the site, as well as determine if mine development is economically feasible.

SMG is a BC owned company and has been testing in Likely since 2005. The company changed name was Skygold from Spanish Mountain Gold in 2009 to emphasize focus on the Spanish Mnt. project.

#### **Interior Fish Think Tank**

# Think Tank points of interest:

- We are "datarich" in sockeye. Extensive inland fisheries research is needed for Chinook and Coho.
- Potential impact of invasive species on the future production dynamics of socially and economically important species is required.

When asked about the tailings pond, Ron Halas, Chief Operating Officer, stated, "We have determined that the most reasonable location for tailing storage is on the land north of the Cedar Creek valley and south of the 1300 Road and airstrip. This location requires a '3-sided' berm to be constructed to store the tailings. We do not foresee the need to adversely impact any creek, stream, or lake in the area by constructing the berm.. Although this option is more costly than placing the tailings in the Nina Lake valley, we believe that it is better for the people of the Likely area by not adversely affecting lakes, streams or creeks". The meeting was attended mostly by those who want to see more jobs in Likely but who are concerned about the water quality and ecological impacts. A few attendees were completely opposed to development due to a lack of trust of industry.

SMG is anticipating that the project will employ approx. 300 people. Environmental impacts will be mitigated (see side panel this page).

If this project goes through, the mine footprint will be within our community forest. A meeting on March 9<sup>th</sup> will shed more light as to what this potential mine will mean for LXCF, as well as the communities of Likely and Soda Creek.

The ultimate goal of the Think Tank was determined to be the creation of an inland fisheries research program that may potentially be located on the site of the QRRC. The topics for research in this program would include: climate change, invasive species, impact of predation, habitat, mining and forestry impacts on the watershed and

fish health. An inland research program is needed because we are "data-rich" in Sockeye, but lack sufficient research for Chinook and Coho. Further, research into the potential impact of invasive species is required. These facts are why an inland research program would prove invaluable, and it would be beneficial for the local area to have it located at QRRC.  $\stackrel{\Leftrightarrow}{\hookrightarrow}$

#### **Birch Tapping & Production Workshop**

Moose Meadows Farm is offering a Birch Syrup Production Workshop. They have scheduldates in Quesnel on March 25th and / or March 26th. Other dates are a possible but will dependent on the level of interest. A minimum of 8 people are needed to run the course at the BEST price rate. It is best to hold the workshop in March so come April, all participants will be prepared and ready to begin tapping.

The cost for the day workshop will be \$100 (HST included) which includes a copy of "The Birch Syrup Production Manual - Tapping into Syrup Boreal Forest Style" (value \$40.00), 2 tapping assemblies, and taste testing. Taste testing will include birch syrup products from all across Canada and Alaska which makes for a tasty addition! There is a discounted rate if the manual is not required (e.g. for couples attending that only need 1 manual).
