This unique opportunity allows you to play a vital role in delivering an enriching summer experience inspired by the Northern Indigenous Youth Summer Science Camp.

Responsibilities

- Lead the development of Indigenous Youth Science Camp programming for 2024.
- Collaborate with Indigenous communities and organizations to promote and support the camps.
- Implement culturally relevant content, drawing inspiration from the successful model of the Northern Indigenous Youth Summer Science Camp.
- Follow up with participants in the program to ensure a culturally sensitive and positive experience.
- Coordinate events and daily camps in collaboration with UNBC Hospitality Services, ensuring cultural inclusivity.
- Provide camp counseling for all-day camps throughout July and August, creating a supportive and respectful environment.
- General support to Coordinators of Youth and Student Transitions Programs.
- Be prepared for potential travel to remote areas in Northern British Columbia to connect with Indigenous communities and deliver programming.

Qualifications and Experience

- Undergraduate or Graduate student with academic success in a related field (e.g., Indigenous Studies, Education, Environmental Science).
- Demonstrated understanding of Indigenous cultures, protocols, and perspectives. Lived experience is preferred.
- Genuine enthusiasm for working with Indigenous youth and fostering their interest in STEAM and traditional ways of knowing.
- Professional and mature attitude with strong communication and time management skills.
- Leadership characteristics with a dynamic and outgoing personality.
