Title: Rural and Remote Indigenous Summer Program Instructor (2 positions available)

Term: April 27 to August 31, 2026

Hours: 35-40 hours per week, Monday to Friday, weekend and overtime opportunities available

Working alongside the Indigenous Youth Coordinator and the Youth and Transition Program Supervisors, this position will focus on the development and delivery of UNBC's summer programming called Active Minds to Indigenous youth living in rural and remote communities or on their traditional territory. Active Minds offers high caliber explorative workshops and camps for youth ages 6 to 18+ with a focus on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math).

## Responsibilities:

- Create and implement STEAM programming for Indigenous youth to be delivered in and on their traditional territory, reservation or home community.
- Design engaging programming that emphasizes creativity and fun with focus on land-based education and a two-eyed seeing approach to STEAM for program participants.
- Willingness and ability to travel to rural and remote communities on a weekly basis.

#### **Qualifications:**

- Undergraduate or Graduate student in any discipline with an understanding of science, engineering, or computer science with an enthusiasm for working with youth.
- Demonstrates understanding of child and youth development including.
- Professional and mature attitude with creative and innovative communication skills.

#### **Preferential Experience:**

- Lived experience or combined knowledge and experience working in rural and remote communities, specifically with Indigenous communities with an understanding of the unique and complex history between colonial institutions and Indigenous peoples
- Understanding of child and youth development, or previous experience working with youth in care and those living in poverty. Preference may be given to those seeking careers in working with children, youth and/or vulnerable populations.
- First aid (CPR-C or Level 1)
- Class 5 drivers license
