The Lead Instructor will develop and lead the delivery of the UNBC Active Minds program, a pre-recruitment program developed by UNBC with a focus on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math). Your leadership will enhance engagement within the institution and the UNBC community, strengthening youth-related programs.

Responsibilities

- **Program Development:** Lead the development and direction of the Active Minds programming for 2026, ensuring it aligns with educational goals and community needs.
- **Outreach Coordination:** Collaborate with schools and community organizations to effectively promote and expand program participation.
- **Participant Follow-Up:** Engage with participants in current programming to gather feedback and ensure a positive experience.
- **Event Coordination:** Organize daily camp activities in partnership with UNBC Hospitality Services, ensuring seamless execution.
- **Camp Counseling:** Provide supportive and inclusive camp counseling throughout July and August, fostering a safe environment for all participants.
- **Program Support:** Assist Coordinators of Youth and Student Transitions Programs in various tasks to ensure smooth operations.
- **Travel:** Potential travel to remote areas in Northern British Columbia may be required.

Qualifications and Experience

- Undergraduate or Graduate student with academic success in science, computer science, engineering or education are preferred.
- Demonstrated understanding of science and an enthusiasm for working with youth.
- Professional and mature attitude.
- Strong communication and time management skills and attention to detail.
- Leadership characteristics with a dynamic and outgoing personality.
